

## World Studies: Course Syllabus

### Required Materials:

- Textbook- *World History* by Ellis and Esler
- 3-ring binder with pockets & loose-leaf paper or spiral notebook & pocket folder
- pens and pencils for writing, student planner

### Course Description:

This course covers the beginnings of civilization, Egypt, Greece, Rome, Medieval Times, the Renaissance, the Enlightenment, the Industrial Revolution, World War I, the Great Depression, World War II, the Cold War, the Nuclear Age, Korea, and Vietnam. Within the context of the class, a variety of social science disciplines will be covered. These may include History, Political Science, Economics and Advertising, World Geography, World Religions, Sociology, and Psychology. Knowledge of current events and issues is also integral to this course.

This is a rigorous course in which students are expected to complete homework and writing assignments in a timely manner. Much of this work must be completed outside of class, to maximize instructional time in the classroom. Assignments may include (but are not limited to) group projects, research papers, in-class presentations, reading and writing assignments and worksheets. Students will also have regular tests over the material throughout the year, and there will be a final examination at the end of each semester.

### Grading Policy:

The grading scale listed in the Carterville High School Student Planner/Handbook is as follows:

Point totals for coursework will differ. Tests, research papers and group projects will be weighed more heavily than daily homework assignments. You can calculate your grade at any point during the semester by adding up the total points you have earned, dividing them by the total points possible, and multiplying the answer by 100 to give you the percentage. You can then refer to the grading scale to see where your percentage falls.

### Absenteeism, Tardiness, Make Up Work and Late Work:

Absenteeism and tardiness will be dealt with according to the policies listed within the student handbook. Make up policies are also listed in the handbook. It is solely the responsibility of any student who has missed class to obtain any make up work, following their return to school, and to complete this work within the time frame given in the student handbook. Failure to make up work missed due to absences will result in a grade of zero for each assignment missed, and this will have a negative impact upon the student's overall grade. Late work will be penalized by 50% the first day it is late, and it will not be accepted beyond the first day past its due date.

### Academic Dishonesty and Plagiarism:

Plagiarism or cheating of any other form will not be tolerated. Plagiarism is defined as a piece of writing or other work that has been copied from someone else and is presented as being your own work. If a student is found to have cheated in any way, they will automatically receive a zero for the work and will face the disciplinary consequences outlined in the student handbook.

### Classroom Expectations:

We will all work to make this classroom a positive learning environment. In order to achieve this goal, I expect all students to:

- Be respectful of your teacher, fellow students, and property
- Come to class on time and prepared with the proper materials; leave cell phones, book bags and coats in your lockers
- Take notes during class, complete assignments on time, and come prepared for exams
- Come see me if you need help, and don't be afraid to ask questions
- Be in your seat when the bell rings and do not line up at the door when class is almost over- you will not be dismissed until I dismiss you
- Follow all school rules within the classroom
- Behave in a non-disruptive manner. I will not tolerate any student disrupting my teaching or the learning of others.
- Treat substitute teachers with respect. Any student who is disruptive for a substitute teacher will be dealt with severely, in accordance with the disciplinary measures detailed in the student handbook.
- Take responsibility for your actions and words.

### Student Success:

To be successful in World Studies, it is imperative that you come to class prepared, take notes and participate in class discussions, complete all assignments on time, and ask for help if you need it. Your notes and assignments are valuable resources for test preparation, so it is important that you save all course materials and use them to review for exams. ## Classroom Rules

- 1.) Do not enter the classroom and ask to go to the bathroom, get a drink, or go to your locker. Take care of that before you enter the classroom. You will get three bathroom passes per semester, and you must have YOUR planner for me to sign as your pass to leave the room.
- 2.) Do not ask me for a pen or pencil just before or after we have started notes. If you wish to buy a pencil, ask me before class begins.
- 3.) Do not use this class period to work on homework for other classes or read books or magazines. If I see such behavior, I will tear up and discard the assignment or confiscate the book or magazine. Once the lesson is over and you have completed the work for my class, then any spare time may be used on work for other classes.
- 4.) Remain in your seat after the lesson is finished and work quietly. If you finish your work, remain in your seat and work on something else quietly.
- 5.) Do not ask me to go to your locker unless the lesson is over and you have completed all of your work. You must show me your completed work upon asking.
- 6.) **Do not interrupt me** during the lesson or when I am helping someone **unless it's important or you have a question pertaining to the lesson.**
- 7.) Please respect my personal space and belongings. Do not get into my cabinet, take anything off of my desk, or use my supplies without permission.
- 8.) Do not open a window or adjust the air conditioning without my permission.
- 9.) Any purses or bags must be placed under your desk for the duration of class. If caught with a cell phone in class, you forfeit your right to carry a purse or a bag or wear a jacket or hoodie in my class.
